Projekttémák

A tudósok felelőssége és a géntechnológia („génetika”)

- Mutassa be a géntechnológiai beavatkozás ökológiai és társadalmi következményeit! Elemezze, milyen előnye és hátránya származik az emberiségnek abból, ha a biotechnológia révén beavatkozik a természet rendjébe!
- Készítsen kérdőíves felmérést iskolája, szűkebb lakóhelye (település, településrész) bevonásával a géntechnológia alkalmazásának a megítélésről!

Szubkultúra, ellenkultúra, underground

- Készítsen riportokat olyan fiatalokkal, fiatal felnőttekkel, akik valamilyen underground csoporthoz tartoznak (tartoztak)! Mutassa be, hogyan és milyen céllal jöttek létre ezek a csoportok, milyen szerepet jelölnek ki a maguk számára, és hogyan értékeli őket a környezetük!
- Készítsen audiovizuális anyagot (ppt, prezi, film stb.) a mai nagyvárosokban fellelhető underground csoportokról!

A családi munkamegosztás szemléletének változása az elmúlt száz évben

- Végezzen életmódkutatást arról, hogyan változott a társadalom felfogása a családi munkamegosztásról!
- Készítsen audiovizuális anyagot (ppt, prezi, film stb.) „Munkamegosztás a mai családban” címmel!

The evaluation of the project work (*maximum 80 points*)

The principal criteria of evaluation are:

- I. the process of the project work (30 points),**
- II. the content of the completed project (50 points).**

I. Evaluation of the process of the project work

II. Evaluation of the content of the completed project

1. Evaluation of a written project (50 points)
2. Evaluation of a project which is based on electronically available documents or images
 - a) Evaluation of written materials attached to the project (10 points)
 - b) Evaluation of the visual or electronic piece submitted for the exam (40 points)
3. Organisation-based project work
 - a) Evaluation of the written materials prepared for the organisation-based project (30 points)
 - b) Evaluation of the management (of the event) (20 points)

Evaluation of the defence of the project work (maximum 20 points)

The candidate defends his/her project work at the oral secondary school-leaving examination. As part of the defence s/he briefly presents the project and answers any questions from the panel.

With the prior approval of the exam panel or the chair of the panel an exam piece is based on electronically available documents or images may be presented. The time taken by this presentation does not form part of the total time allotted to the candidate's oral examination. However, jointly viewing the piece enables the members of the panel to put relevant questions to the candidate and to understand his/her work.

As part of the oral defence, the candidate may use any of the portfolio materials (hypothesis, plan, network plan, draft, bibliography) for purposes of demonstration and the assessor may also encourage him/her to do so.

It must not be to the candidate's disadvantage in his/her final scoring if any non-project related questions are put to him/her which s/he cannot answer.

The following criteria and maximum sub-scores of the 20-point total must be applied in the evaluation of the defence of the project work.

Note:

The evaluation criteria of the other task that is part of the oral examination, the presentation about the examination question, are detailed in the exam specification of the subject (Ministry of Education decree number 40/2002 (V. 24.)). When the list of examination questions is compiled, the school where the examination is held must specify the expected elements of the answers to the examination questions for each criterion as well as the maximum points for each sub-score out of the maximum of 50 points that can be awarded.

Originality in the elaboration of the chosen topic	The written materials prepared for the organisation-based project are the candidate's own work. On the basis of the paper it can be clearly ascertained what components of the organisational process are the independent work of the candidate and what the other participants and fellow organisers accomplished. The paper is a good reflection of the candidate's own experience gained during the organisational process and the theoretical knowledge that s/he gained during the preparation period. The candidate has described the impact that the event had on the community.	4	
Formal requirements, expected length, structure and language accuracy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The length of the written exam piece is appropriate. The paper is proportionate, easy to follow, and is divided into paragraphs. The text consists of full sentences, it is logically structured and the composition is clear and of a high standard.
